A. Basilique Saint Denis. 1135-1140. First Gothic work of architecture. Burial place of French Kings.

B. Cathédrale Notre-Dame d'Amiens. 1220-1270. Tallest completed cathedral in France, largest volume.

C. Cathédrale Notre-Dame de Rouen. 1202-1880. Gothic and Renaissance. Abundantly painted by Monet.

D. Église St-Etienne. 1067-1081. Romanesque. Twin Romanesque towers topped with Gothic spires.

E. Mont Saint-Michel. 1017-1521. Romanesque. Benedictine Abbey built on an island stronghold.

F. Notre Dame Chartres. 1194-1260. Two towers, one Romanesque, one Gothic. Renowned stained glass.

G. Château de Versailles. Royal Chateau. 1664-now. Hall of Mirrors, Apartments, L'Opera, Chapel, Museum.

H. Louvre. 12th Century to today. Of importance: Fine art, paintings, sculptures, antiquities.

I. Musee des Arts Decoratifs. 1905, in a wing of the Louvre. A museum of interior design and furnishings.

J. Cathédrale Notre-Dame de Paris. 1163-1345. Rose windows, flying buttresses, Romanesque sculpture
