- A. Basilique Saint Denis.** 1135-1140. First Gothic work of architecture. Burial place of French Kings.
- B. Cathédrale Notre-Dame d'Amiens.** 1220-1270. Tallest completed cathedral in France, largest volume.
- C. Cathédrale Notre-Dame de Rouen.** 1202-1880. Gothic and Renaissance. Abundantly painted by Monet.
- D. Église St-Etienne.** 1067-1081. Romanesque. Twin Romanesque towers topped with Gothic spires.
- E. Mont Saint-Michel.** 1017-1521. Romanesque. Benedictine Abbey built on an island stronghold.
- F. Notre Dame Chartres.** 1194-1260. Two towers, one Romanesque, one Gothic. Renowned stained glass.
- G. Château de Versailles.** Royal Chateau. 1664-now. Hall of Mirrors, Apartments, L'Opera, Chapel, Museum.
- H. Louvre.** 12th Century to today. Of importance: Fine art, paintings, sculptures, antiquities.
- I. Musée des Arts Décoratifs.** 1905, in a wing of the Louvre. A museum of interior design and furnishings.
- J. Cathédrale Notre-Dame de Paris.** 1163-1345. Rose windows, flying buttresses, Romanesque sculpture
